Oxford, Connecticut- "We like going green" announced the Town of Oxford First Selectman Mary Ann Drayton-Rogers during a meeting of the Town Board of Selectmen, according to a July 22, 2009 *Voices* article written by Leda Quirke. At the mid-July meeting of the Town of Oxford, Connecticut, the “Board of Selectmen voted unanimously to enter into a contract with Ultra Green Energy Services to supply fuel oil and diesel gas to the town. The products [will] contain 5 percent [biodiesel].”

Oxford Town Attorney Francis Teodosio “‘urged acceptance of the contract’, saying ‘the terms it contained were user-friendly.’”

First Selectman Mary Ann Drayton-Rogers said “the contract was the result of lengthy negotiations between the town, Ultra Green, and the current provider.” “The town, under a two-year contract ratified several years ago, still must use up a substantial volume of fuel contracted for \$3.529 a gallon before it can take advantage of Ultra Green's \$2.35 per gallon price.”



“Sometime in December or January, when the supply is used up, Ultra Green will take over” said Oxford Town Attorney Francis Teodosio.”
